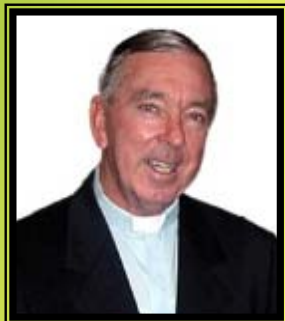
"Tell them to do good, to be rich in good works, to be generous, ready to share."

May you Spirit of Love guide us on our journey.

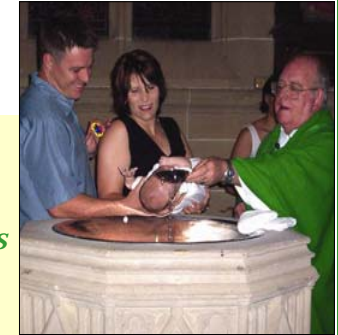
